IN NEW YORK, Chicago and LA, franklinreport.com offers a catalog of professionals, each with a customer rating—and all the businesses come recommended by industry professionals or clients. For national sites, check out servicemagic.com and servicemaster.com. Both offer customer reviews, but you have to fill out a service request to get the info e-mailed to you. And the listings can be slightly less reliable, since businesses pay to be advertisers on the site or pay a commission for bookings. —Maria Beaudoin
